### HOUSE

#### In Committee

HB 413— Relative to Payment By The State Of A Portion Of Retirement System Contributions Of Political Subdivision Employers.

- Division 1 voted to retain the bill in Finance 8-0
- This is simply due to the fact that they will not have budget estimates until March 16th and the bill has to be reported out of committee on that date.
- Rep Ober stated that once they have the estimates they may try to work this bill into the budget.
