SB 155- Relative to Implementation of the Medicaid Managed Care Program OTPA 20-2 consent

Amendment 2017-1476H OTP 14-8

Moves the date back to July 1, 2019

Committee felt they needed to establish a House position on this

While the committee placed this bill on consent, it is likely that it will be pulled off consent for a full vote

Public Affairs Executive Session

HB 461— relative to the acceptance of grants by Carroll county ITL 4-1

Cathy and George took up an extensive lobbying effort with key members on the committee to get an ITL motion

While Senator Kahn did try to move his amendment it was not taken up and the committee only moved the bill.
